# Monty Hall another Way

The idea is to generalize the problem to see if it is related to other probability and choice type problems and recognize the similar results and tendencies - probability of 1/2 to 1/3. Then you try to see if there are similar maths or logical abstractions involved.

Some things to notice (nota bene - note well N.B.) - all boxes must be in play, the game is stable, comprehensive. The strategy works for the Group on **average** and **not** the individual. The group improves its outcome towards a transfinite limit of 30%. The individual (their own choice as part of the group) has no change in their probability for their own choice - no matter what "strategy" they choose - but for all individuals as a group their probability is reduced from 50% to 30% if they adopt

the group strategy. The group strategy reduces the range of possibilities for the group from a range of (100% to 0%) success rate and makes it approach a single dogmatic 30% rate.

This is essentially the **argument of a balance between group and individual choices** - a plurality - like I illustrate on my graphs.

It also depends how much information can be shared and when. Sharing a strategy before the game can result in a chance of 0% when all the numbers are arranged in two large loops designed ("evil" warden) or randomly arranged to exclude the strategy. E.g. in a 4 prisoner box example numbers 1 and 2 are in boxes 3 and 4 and numbers 3 and 4 are in boxes 1 and 2. The **strategy is a guaranteed 100% failure** in certain circumstances - on things unknown. What are you going to do when your strategy does not work? **Blame the Devil?** 

But if information is shared in a pass the message down - secret whispers - kind of way the first prisoner has 50% chance then every prisoner then on has 100% chance. i.e. the first prisoner picks boxes number 1 to 50 and remembers - writes down each number in the box. So he now can tell prisoners if their number is in the boxes numbered 1 to 50 or they must be in boxes numbered 51 to 100.

I put this into the general problem of - **no-one really understands most things** - including Zipf, Benford, the power law or probability. Most things **cannot be fully understood** - even transfinitely - measurement, observation, definition, etc.

Humans will sometimes make the right choice many times - "a miracle" is declared - and then others will ask how they did it. They will say "I prayed to God" or "Sacrificed a baby goat" or "washed myself in the sacred waters" or "had visions" or "magic beans" or "I did lots of complex mathematical models you would not understand", etc

This hypothetical idea of "there exists an optimal choice strategy for the group" is not well supported - but many people believe it and will try to convince everyone to adopt their "certain strategy". Greens/Labour, causists (save the planet, save the world, defeat the enemy, etc), binary extremists, religious zealots, corrupt, bad actors, communists, fascists, experts, feminists, women (on average - quotas - inclusion), dim-wits, ill-informed, uneducated, sooth sayers, oracles, attention seekers, deluded psychopaths, epidemiologists, etc.

Communism, fascism, feminism, equality, Mobs, Dictators (benevolent or otherwise), tyrants, experts, social scientists, binary certaintists, women (on average - quotas - "equality") and dimwits lack the understanding of coherence and complexity that hard working science, philosophy and mathematicians explore to discover patterns.

My working hypothesis is always there ready to be argued - not mandated as certain policy or strategy.

I noticed and emphasize this human idea of exploration by choice of level of abstracted concepts - How to frame things - by recently exploring a history narrative of a Muslim writer who had sought to reduce everything about humans to looking at the least complex words. "Some Berbers live in houses when they have excess food" "Berbers take camels into the desert", etc. This attempt to simplify (reducto) was contrasted with my recent re-examining of Dante's The Divine Comedy, Beowulf and

other long form and detailed complex individual (thousands of individual characters) narrative poems. The way of exploring, writing and analyzing information was changing in form - the exploration methods were changing around 1100s onwards. Gloriously illustrated manuscripts were emerging as ways of looking at the human story and trying to understand it. Troubadours were presenting information in different ways.

#### A variety of choice of abstractions could be considered an idea of "the west"

I do not understand all of the **probability choice strategy** type scenarios - but at the highest level - the notion that **one certain strategy** is "the certain answer" is a **BAD idea**. The *all the eggs in one basket* because I fully understand the issues around probability and choice. It "feels" (like a woman) a little **Totalitarian** to me.

At best I come up with - "my working hypothesis is" - probability clouds in general bounds and constraints at my selected level of abstraction and a recognition of humans adopting their own choices in life strategies (because they may know something I don't - or they may randomly choose a better way) being a better strategy - but I am not certain (tish boom). Plurality of the Human Condition.

As soon as **someone declares their certainty of understanding** - I question them - I ask them to explain it and prove it to me.

We see this at school when a teacher asks the young students "For our diversity and inclusion report we need to know what Religion you are" (primary school) - and I say "what you talking about Lewis?" - What is this word you just made up and what does it mean? Explain this idea of yours.

So are you saying instead of doing what Mummy and Daddy and family tell me at home I should do what this God of yours tells you? So you are just the messenger, are you and God speaks into your head directly?


Well Jon, Religion is **very popular around here** - everybody has one. You want to be popular don't you?

Well, Miss, I am not so sure - You do things which are **NOT popular** - why do you do that, Miss? Is it entrenched hypocrisy, permanent incoherence, cognitive dissonance, insanity, or the word of God speaks through you?

We see Anthony Albanese (in his mind he is the new "Messiah" arms raised high in the air in triumph), Penny Wong, Tanya Plibersek, Andrew Barr, Andrew Leigh, feminists, state premiers and staff, politicians everywhere, weak minded men and all the Green/Labour Zealots say "We believe in climate change not like those evil others who don't - the unbelievers". Then like any delusional, psychopathic, narcissistic, virtue signaling, smuglifunt (ABC, SBS, Zealots, Communists, Tyrants, Dictators, Feminists, Women (on average - quotas - inclusion) tribal cannibals, etc they proceed to kill anyone who gets in their way or dares to question. Even those who have a slightly nuanced discussion of their God of certainty are demonized and destroyed by the smug, brutally violent swords of the Mob. (See Cathars in South of France - and burning people alive)

As soon as they say "Believe me" - I know they are too stupid to understand anything much at all or I must give up my mind (Fat, Dumb and Lazy - complacent) and become a Mob lest they kill me and my family.

What many mathematicians, economists, epidemiologists and others fail to appreciate the nature of the problem. They have not understood the human condition and in particular - the universe as it is.

We can look at Monty Hall and the 100 rooms problem and work out what is going on. The Game stays the same - everyone does the same thing in unison. Like a Mob and binary extremists types. The always strategize - the not always strategize and the "others" in a binary drama triangle way.


In the 100 room problem - the game is set up and any comprehensive number based strategy will work to change probabilities. The loop of certainty is there to see for all as explained by Derek. Derek also understands the switch from 50% to 30% probability based on a shared Mob strategy in a transfinite choice game. I am not sure if he understands how significant an insight that is.

Most people have no appreciation of the mental leaps they make when they make them.

This is the Mob of "ultimate Good" - their certain God of "**improving the system** - for the group - the **greater good** (not us personally, of course)", "best choice" and beating probabilities. But what if the Room changes all the time - as in Life? And the people change and make mistakes as well - and

everything else. How good is the "strategy" then? Not only does the frame of the Game change but an infinity of others things as well. The not, not.

I map the confusion matrix of 4 boxes symbology to my new model of 3 spaces in a 4 sided box.

The unbounded infinity is an initial self-reference recursion - or to put it another way - I have bounded and constrained my unbounded and constrained infinity as some kind of permanent hypocrite - possibly. Certainty (or anything else) cannot be measured for not known things. It is an undefined hypothesis space as in "who knows" or "God only knows"

Mapping 4 concepts (single/binary(continuum) is/certainty) to 3 spaces (areas) in 2 dimensions (duality - measurement(certainty) and declaration(is)) is a significant mental leap.

I have made "not, not", "not known" and "unbounded infinity" **certain concepts** in an **initial self-reference** and **recursive** way. A permanent confusion.

Many philosophers and writers map to this model. Tao

(Conceived of as) having no name, it is the Originator of heaven and earth; (conceived of as) having a name, it is the Mother of all things. Always without desire we must be found, If its deep mystery we would sound; But if desire always within us be, Its outer fringe is all that we shall see.

Under these **two aspects**, it is really the same; but as **development takes place**, it receives the different names. Together we call them the Mystery. **Where the Mystery is the deepest is the gate of all that is subtle and wonderful."** 

We see initial self-reference and the recursive **infinity of mystery** - the development takes place to name things to declare them "is"

"All in the world **know** the **beauty of the beautiful**, and in doing this they have **(the idea of) what ugliness is;** they all know the skill of the skilful, and in doing this they have (the idea of) what the **want of skill** is. So it is that **existence and non-existence give birth the one to (the idea of) the other;** that difficulty and ease produce the one (the idea of) the other; that length and shortness

fashion out the one the figure of the other; that (the ideas of) height and lowness arise from the contrast of the one with the other; that the musical notes and tones become harmonious through the relation of one with another; and that being before and behind give the idea of one following another."

The NOT appears and merges harmoniously (musical notes and tones - sliding scale) with the declared 'is" and other declared "iss" so knowledge develops. "want of skill" becomes the Null,0 duality of definition and measurement starting point.

The "lack of skill" is the same as the lack of anything - but at a very high level of abstraction in my model it becomes a "Lack of Certainty" (NULL/ZERO) - a duality - not enough measurement and/or not enough definition.

Not **sufficient/utility(Mill)** measurement **and/or** definition.

A "Lack of certainty" is a different to "Not certain". Not certain becomes the place where measurements of certainty are sufficient to declare (I have all these common MEASUREMENTS of what has been declared as certain before) but questions emerge and still remain of "DEFINITION" the declared "is" of what certainty means. When humans reach this space - even scientists - they say "I don't know what to think anymore" - their dogma of measurement and definition is being questioned by the Chaos of the not known. "Golly Gosh - that was unexpected! Who would have thought that.." - well - I did, actually. It is obvious that unexpected things happen. THINK ABOUT THAT.

It is time to question definitions and re-imagine the measurements required to declare what certainty is.


This noticing of the emerging questions is difficult when the sunk cost bias and confirmation bias is strong.

Making the argument of "it is time to Question" is very difficult in educated and engaged cultures ("enlightend") - let alone cultures dominated by tyrants, mobs, tribes and binary extremists.

The issue was where to put the 4 measures on the Box and - one for each side - and the then create a kind of intuitive curve in the space which maps to the other curves of statistics - not as a dogma - but as generally abstracted shape of things. One insight was recognizing that Energy as defined by Einstein was really a duality in a box classification binary sense making issue. There was a tension of duality in energy. Energy of Hypothesis (thought/question/investigate) and Energy of Action. This emerged out a simple mathematical rearrangement of Einstein's equation to make a unity of 1. So it is with my model of choosing where I put those tensions and what shape I give them on my model.



- **Energy of Question** is the "Not, Not" line and represents the effort required along the idea of transfinite (bounded and certain **definition**) into an unbounded infinite definition extreme (infinitely question). This space significantly overlaps the Chaos space as best it can.
- Chaos (C squared the speed of light constant "squared" (infinite recursion) as opposed to multiplied by itself to give a "certain number") was based on the frequency line of Transfinite measurement which highlights the difficulty of measurement of chaos from how we certainly measure things now to the idea of infinity of measurement ideas and limits of measurement. E.g. how to measure a Virus or Volcano are we measuring defined things the "Right Way" do we have enough measured information. It is here humans tend to the binary extremes "Good/Bad" and Virtue Energy of Question is ignored and censored because of humans Fat, Dumb and Lazy complacency no-need to think or question because satiated we have Mass of Certain action to keep us focused and busy. All things seem Known and Certain.
- Energy of Action I had initially put on the bottom line of the Box as a kind of "doing idea" to balance Mass of things "built by doing" but I am now inclined to swap Mass and Energy of Action around. Energy of Action seems to be on the left hand side of measurement the energy of observing, noticing and measuring. I also swapped the curve around so it pushed towards the Declared Is space more rather than the Not, Not line so Mass and Energy of Action have more overlap. This is where we tend to Confirmation Bias and Sunk Cost Bias. Our Known Certainty the most highly constrained and bounded area of our Mobs, Groupthink, Tribes, Dogma and binary thinking.
- Mass now moves the bottom line representing a certainty of definition (the declared is the Dogma) e.g. this is defined as a "House", "Road", "Word", etc it retains some permanence in memory and in space/time. I hypothesize this allows a better alignment in the model of how the "Message" the Blip curve changes to a longer plurality curve as humans remember and instantiate things in "reality" and "space/time" (see Mutilated by Virtue Destroyed by Tribalism Inundated with Lies <a href="https://humanistman.com/wp-content/uploads/2022/07/Mutilated-by-Virtue-Destroyed-by-Tribalism-Inundated-with-Lies.pdf">https://humanistman.com/wp-content/uploads/2022/07/Mutilated-by-Virtue-Destroyed-by-Tribalism-Inundated-with-Lies.pdf</a>

The corruption model was developed to highlight a hierarchy of spheres of influence - a **balance of certain community structures** and how LAW and DOGMA tend to in a - Tyrannically and in Dictatorial way - swamp and devour (Corrupt) the other layers of a **well balanced and Harmonious society**. This a "right" **level of abstraction** argument - separation of powers we see developing over the last several thousand years and written about by many people in many ways. Hobbes and others.

It is NOT courage to step outside of your role - nor is it heresy but the questions then becomes when to question? When to declare your certainty bias and then have that bias argument? And who with?

#### I argue with myself because no-one will argue with me.

I put it all in writing because it helps me articulate my thoughts - it manifests thinking in some kind of "reality" and enables me to think more.

# Monks - Virtue - Hypocrisy - Least Harm

I am not sure exactly when monk idea started but the idea of wandering of to the desert to have some great insight into the word of God, living in cave, living on a cold mountain top, having an austere life or living like a beggar - started to become very popular from about -500 onwards around Egypt, Levant, India, Tibet, Italy and then spread all over the world so we see this Monk idea everywhere now.

The general idea is that they are **trying to make you feel guilty** because of their **chosen suffering** (willing sacrifice to "god") to exalt the word of God and beg for "Alms for the poor". Their idea is that they are therefore humble and wise in a certain godly way -because of their chosen suffering and the "work" to help the poor. We see this too, in those who are very different or randomly disfigured in an usual way - the "mark of God" - they are "special". (Feminists claim "special" victim status all the time)

This is a passive aggressive manipulative extortion racket based on manipulation of your ignorance, fear, guilt and virtue. The smug mob/tribal/binary types want you to stop thinking and habitually signal your virtue. They rely on it to make their income. That is what taking the knee, apologizing for things you did not do, wearing their ribbon, flying their mob flags, promoting blacks, promoting women, etc. You have money - I don't - give it to me - is the plain message some beggars and other criminals will say straight out. The fact that you work hard for a living and have family to support is not their concern. Their concern is to manipulate you, like any criminal, to hand over your money. Practice telling them to "fuck off" so that you can break this weak minded habit of yours which does nothing but encourage the criminals to continue their spree.

I will explore the charity idea (fish or fishing, bible or food) later but let us examine Benedict, Francis, Dominic and the Buddhist Monks. (Maybe charity is giving someone a job - even if it is that of a "slave"?)

They beg for money and food each day. People give them these things because it makes them feel good and less guilty. Francis gave everything away so he could become a virtuous beggar.

So Monks are permanent virtue signalers - a chosen way of life - begging and taking money and food from people poorer than themselves and usually far less educated and gullible - taking advantage of poor, gullible people hoping for a better life if they give away what little they have to "god" and his chosen virtuous monks. They also guiltrip the "rich" into donating for the "virtue".

Think about that for a while.

Most of the world was/is poor and starving for long periods of time and things are still very difficult in Asia where many of these monks still thrive.

In places like USA there are many rich religions - mainly because they don't pay any Tax and are considered charities. We see this in Australia where churches/religions obtain prime land and resources and are considered Tax and other legislation free. They hang on to their resources and pass down wealth through generations.


This Rush to virtue for the Monk, the Monk has so much certainty in their Books of learning and themselves, their knowledge, their intelligence, their understanding, their view of the world, their

lack of questions (other than "what colour shoes does God wear", "did Jesus have a feminist and more powerful sister", "what is the best name for God which is not Blasphemy") and Smug Virtuous certainty - that they then seek to indoctrinate - under the guise of "teaching" - everyone they can get their smug hands on. This smug certainty of education we see everywhere (see The Melbourne Declaration <a href="https://www.acara.edu.au/reporting/national-report-on-schooling-in-australia/nrosia2009/national-policy-context/educational-goals" "Goal 2" All young Australians become successful learners, confident and creative individuals, and active and informed citizens" - Julia Gillard, Andrew Barr, and all the other virtue-signaling dim-wits "education" ministers, etc made sure that virtue signaling on climate change, blacks, women and any other certain causes could be installed as "activism" and "conversion" of those who refused to believe the "dogma" - rather than "questioning". At the same time they profess that they are "giving to the poor" - a kind of "taking from the rich and giving to the poor" in a godlike virtue display and what is "right" and proper.

So this begging idea absolves the Monk from taking any **responsibility** or **accountability** for earning an income - from growing food, getting a job in the community, earning money, making the community thrive rather than filling their own virtue cup. But also too they **corrupt the learning** of those who donate the very little they have - and encourage a reliance on **habitual virtue signaling** from them as well - rather than a question of exploration of alternative ideas. # Socrates sacrificed his life for the question. Smuglifunts sacrifice everyone else's life for their certainty.

The **least Harm principle** is not a new concept - it goes back in history at least to **Hippocrates** (-370) <a href="https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Hippocrates">https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Hippocrates</a> and the **idea of** thinking, measuring, noticing, keeping

records and **trying to predict what might happen next** - a **prognosis** - rather than jumping to a quick and potentially worse "Cure" for the patient.

His *paradigm shift* needs to be recognized as a **significant idea**. He must have **noticed how many patients died** while being "treated" with certain "cure". One can imagine the doctors of the day saying "oh well - The Gods took him in the end". They move from channeling Gods of certainty - into very human interventions which become a **responsibility** and **accountability** of the Doctor and a **need** for the doctor to **question and understand more** - to **learn**. These things could be considered ideas of "the west".

But it is John Stuart Mill who is remembered frequently for the "Least Harm" idea.

I disagree with Mills here and his concept of the enlightened well-meaning Tyrant (too stupid to understand how stupid they are) - "Despotism is a legitimate[Pg 19] mode of government in dealing with barbarians, provided the end be their improvement, and the means justified by actually effecting that end. Liberty, as a principle, has no application to any state of things anterior to the time when mankind have become capable of being improved by free and equal discussion. Until then, there is nothing for them but implicit obedience to an Akbar or a Charlemagne, if they are so fortunate as to find one. But as soon as mankind have attained the capacity of being guided to their own improvement by conviction or persuasion (a period long since reached in all nations with whom we need here concern ourselves), compulsion, either in the direct form or in that of pains and penalties for non-compliance, is no longer admissible as a means to their own good, and justifiable only for the security of others."

**Like many others**, Mills has fallen for the **ends justifies the means** and **Greatest Good** argument - certainty of certain "good' - the barbarians "improvement".

We will spend all our lives surrounded by Tyrants and dim-wits and Barbarians which no amount despotism will "improve" - and there is no such thing as equal discussion - there is a plurality of discussion. The reality is - that people like Penny Wong, Tanya Plibersek, Andrew Barr, Andrew Leigh, Helen Watchirs, Greens/Labour types, ABC board management and staff and the Magistrates in Canberra courts - all the feminists, women (on average - quotas - inclusion - victim group) etc will never "improve" not only do they have no interest (Fat, Dumb and Lazy complacency) - they have no skill, capability, question or knowledge of what improvement might be.

Secondly, the principle requires liberty of tastes and pursuits; of framing the plan of **our life to suit our own character**; of doing as we like, subject to such consequences as may follow: without impediment from our fellow-creatures, so long as what we do **does not harm them**, **even though they should think our conduct foolish, perverse, or wrong**. Thirdly, from this liberty of[Pg 23] **each individual**, follows the liberty, within the same limits, of **combination among individuals**; **freedom to unite**, for any purpose **not involving harm to others**: the persons combining being supposed to be of full age, and **not forced or deceived**."

He contradicts (hypocrisy) his idea about "individual" **barbarians** but "even though they should think our conduct foolish, perverse, or wrong" - does he think barbarian conduct is "foolish, perverse or wrong" or something else altogether?

Virtue signalers tend to ignore the least harm principle and rush to signal their virtue - using their certain god - rather than noticing thinking, observing or predicting what might happen. They ejaculate their virtue on any one they can find to say "See look how good and great I am" - narcissistic, self-possessed, deluded, psychopathic, etc.

"In February 1887, volumes III and IV of Creighton's **History of the Papacy** were published by Longmans. These volumes narrowed the focus to specific popes, chiefly, Sixtus IV, Alexander VI, and Julius II. In his characteristic approach of maintaining historiographical balance and considering individuals to be very much mired in their historical eras, Creighton did not single out anyone for special condemnation, even Alexander VI, whose great disrepute Creighton felt was "largely due to the fact that he did not add hypocrisy to his other vices."[63] Earlier, in 1885, Creighton had agreed to become the first editor of a new journal, the English Historical Review. [64] Now, he requested Acton to review his two volumes for the journal. The review Acton wrote was not only hostile but, in Creighton's view, also **obscure**. In the following weeks, there were contentious exchanges between the two men, polarising eventually into their two views of history, Acton's normative approach versus **Creighton's more relativist one**. It was in one of these exchanges that Acton penned three sentences, one of which was to become an oft-quoted epigram. "Historical responsibility," wrote Acton, "has to make up for the want of legal responsibility. **Power tends to corrupt, and absolute power corrupts** absolutely. Great men are almost always bad men, even when they exercise influence and not authority." Acton's attack, however, did lead Creighton to rethink his own position somewhat. In an 1895 paper, he would write that the papacy, "which had been established for the promotion of morality" had in fact "provided the means for the utmost immorality."

**To lord Acton** 1887 - "I have no love for heroes, and I rarely find them in my particular path: but I admit that I hesitate to find men so villainous as in your scales of moral judgment they would be. I like to stand aside as much as possible, and content myself with the humble part of a chorus in a Greek play. I try to put myself in the place of my personages. I judge them more severely for their own personal contribution to the world's misdoings than for their acquiescence in existing systems. I think worse of Sixtus IV for his share in the Pazzi1 matter than for his **authorising the** 

**Spanish Inquisition.** I suppose my readers can draw morals for themselves. I think that in history, as in private life, I hope I try to find out men's good qualities before their bad ones, their good intentions before their evil means. The statesman always seems to me in a non-moral position, because he has to consider what is possible as well as what is best, and the compromise is necessarily pitiable. The growth of a public conscience has been slow; I don't wish to antedate its influence. It seems to me that the great charge against the Church after the thirteenth century is that it did not promote, but hindered its growth. Perhaps I have not made this clear."

He admits to trying to write history to engage with the readers - make it interesting for them. He writes in the style of a fairytale or a gossipy narrative of individuals and their interactions and responses (like womens's gossip - on average - quotas - inclusion) - were people "naturally respond" by repressing other people. He presents the people within a drama triangle of certain good and bad and emphasizes some things and omits others. So his level of abstraction is mostly fixed. His Zoom and Focus do not vary much, his granularity is quite detailed and he inserts his own judgement and opinion often and fails to explore any questions or alternative information which does not conform to his beliefs. 

"The knowledge of good and evil was not an exclusive and sublime prerogative assigned to states, or nations, or majorities. When it had been defined and recognised as something divine in human nature, its action was to limit power by causing the sovereign voice within to be heard above the expressed will and settled custom of surrounding men. By that hypothesis, the soul became more sacred than the state, because it receives light from above, as well as because its concerns are eternal, and out of all proportion with the common interests of government. That is the root from which liberty of Conscience was developed, and all other liberty needed to confine the sphere of power, in order that it may not challenge the supremacy of that which is highest and best in man." ..."Taking long periods, we perceive the advance of moral over material influence, the triumph of general ideas, the gradual amendment. The line of march will prove, on the whole, to have been from force and cruelty to consent and association, to humanity, rational persuasion, and the persistent appeal to common, simple, and evident maxims. We have dethroned necessity, in the shape both of hunger and of fear, by extending the scene from Western Europe to the whole world, so that all shall contribute to the treasure of civilisation, and by taking into partnership in the enjoyment of its rewards those who are far off as well as those who are below. We shall give our attention to much that has failed and passed away, as well as to the **phenomena of progress**, which help to build up

the world in which we live. For History must be our deliverer not only from the undue influence of other times, but from the undue influence of our own, from the **tyranny of environment and the pressure of the air we breathe**. It requires all historic forces to **produce their record** and **submit to judgment**, and it promotes the faculty of resistance to contemporary surroundings by **familiarity with other ages and other orbits of thought.**"

Here, Lord Acton falls victim to the binary idea of "advancement" or "progress" - which we see now as a "familiar" idea around us of "progressives" who declare what certain progress is and their virtue associated with it. I do not think that he is attempting to be a binary thinker or deluded - he does recognize the need to write what he thinks and why down and allow others to examine to judge from other ages and orbits of thought. This takes some courage to expose your ideas to others who judge you and he might enjoy discussion with me about the ideas - as evidenced from his letters to others involved in history - a willingness to engage in discussion and debate. With The smug and sanctimonious Mandell Creighton - we see a sneering morally superior attitude we see around us now - with all those people who are so sure of themselves and are quick to assert how morally or intellectually superior they are their opinions are - without having any ability to learn or engage in further debate and discussion. The Ket genes - and the ability to survive in the cold (killing mammoths and reindeer, making snow shelters with bones and skins) - made their way across the ice bridge to dominate into Alaska and the rest of America right down to the southern tip of south America - including the Eskimos, Mesoamericans and other Indian tribes.

This abstraction of "something" to hold on to in the cold dark dangerous days is a theme of humanity.

Gods of certainty have taken various from human to animal to magical and imaginary.

# Mark Butler - Nursing Homes - Barking Mad - Marking Bad

Greens/Labour recently got into federal government and Mark Butler - as the new minister of health - proudly announced he would mandate 24 hour nurses in nursing homes - saying "it is obvious isn't it - it is in the name".

Now I have written to Mark - as chief policy person for the Labour types - many times over the years - he ignores me - but let us examine this public announcement of his.

He declares this out of nowhere and without context at a time while most of Australia is still under "Emergency Law" (3 years and still going like any tyrannical dictatorship) where every state or federal politician makes a "declaration" of law which mandates what everyone in society must do or be jumped on police, fined and go to jail. We see this is "language" mandates as well - the 'Right' words not to "cause offence".

He declares this - having spent years in Parliament studying and working on the big issues and ideas that the Green/Labour party have for how Australia should be and what needs to be done in the country. They have kicked around some ideas amongst themselves about how to save the planet - stated a few things in budget reply documents and are now proceeding on their grand plan to "save" lives with their certain plans.

There is no detailed analysis or discussion of Mark's idea - not even a debate - he stepped up to the camera on morning TV and announced it. Many of them are run as charities - he would know this if he **examined the charities database** (as I have done) and seen where they are located - their names - the institutions which run them, the financial documents and establishment documents. This requires work and analysis - as I have done - to explore and read about all of these places and get some understanding of the issues involved. It is called - in politics - being **across your brief**. See <a href="https://www.acnc.gov.au/">https://www.acnc.gov.au/</a>. But maybe he has done this work and spent decades consulting everyone in the industry - how would I know - he certainly did not say this - he did not say "I have spent decades consulting with industry and we have all agreed on some general improvements in the Industry which has much support and the we are now working on implementation and change issues and options" - instead he said "I am going to mandate nurses in nursing homes 24/7 - it is obvious - it is in the name"

Many homes are really there to assist - rather than "nurse" people - to provide support, a sense of community and independence - not dependence on being "nursed" - it is an insult to those who still try to maintain their dignity of independence. Respite care is provided sometimes and temporary care might be needed for post operation and accidents. Severely disabled people - even quite young - can require a huge amount of full-time care - traditionally provided by family members but also the state. Palliative care tends to be provided in specialist homes as a last step before death but is problematic because people want to be surrounded by people and things they know rather than die in a strange place. People also die in hospitals during or after the last steps of massively expensive surgical interventions. It is complex.

Most old people, aged care, convalescent, rest, supported living, retirement, etc homes - **tend not to have much money** and rely on the limited income they get from the people who live there. Many are run by religious, ethnic or other groups - so there will be Jewish, Hindi, Indian, Chinese or Language groupings so people can communicate with each other in their native language. Many are located in the community where they grew up - and some are now in very expensive areas in the cities - because the cities have grown and changed around them.

Few people can afford to have full time care until they die. Many rely of family, friends, community, volunteers and government services.

Many homes already have staff trained to some degree in basic health care issues and are well aware of the doctors, dentists, hospitals and ambulance arrangements in their area - it is a feature of how they need to run their business. Some use nurses on semi-permanent/casual basis - as required by the people and their needs at the time - based on the circumstances and time. i.e. not mandated by some idiot politician signaling their virtue about "saving" people, the world, the planet, etc.

So Mark's idea - is not only foolish and ill-considered - it is designed to scare and raise the anxiety levels of those - who are already highly stressed and susceptible to change and anxiety. The **ability to afford** to employ nurses 24 hours a day is something **we struggle to do in hospitals around the** 

**country**. There are vast shortages of trained nurses and little likelihood of employing people in those jobs when they can sit around all day and whinge while working in "human rights" agencies (Helen Watchirs) complaining about gender pronouns.

24/7 nurses do not really happen - even in hospitals - the night shift is always smaller than the day shift - yet he wants 100% nurses in "nursing" homes every hour of the day.

"Putting nurses back into (a deliberate lie) nursing homes 24/7 – Labor will lift care and quality standards and improve health outcomes by making it mandatory to have a registered nurse onsite 24 hours a day in residential aged care facilities. This was a key recommendation of the Aged Care Royal Commission which was ignored by the Morrison Government. 24/7 registered nurses will become required from July 2023.

Lifting the average care time for each resident to 215 minutes per day, including 44 minutes with a registered nurse – Labor will provide an average of an extra 35 minutes of care time per resident per day than current levels. This was a **key recommendation** of the Aged Care Royal Commission which was ignored by the Morrison Government. This means more time for meals, showers, dressing, wound management and much more. This improved care-time standard will commence in October 2024. Labor will maintain the planned mandatory 200 care minutes date of October 2023." ...

... "This investment in aged care will total \$2.5 billion over the forward estimates."

No - they are still barking Mad and using taxpayer money to signal virtue.

This program provides entry-level services to help people remain independent at home and in the community. The next largest program was permanent residential aged care — around 245,000 people lived permanently in a residential aged care facility at some point during 2019–20."

So 2.5 billion for 245,000 people - MOST who don't need nurses and are not sick - many are old and need support - not a hospital.

Yes, there are high levels of degenerative physical and mental diseases - especially dementia in old women <a href="https://www.abs.gov.au/statistics/health/causes-death">https://www.abs.gov.au/statistics/health/causes-death</a> - but many homes who have places like gardens, trees, things to do, engagement with the local community, volunteers, activities, things of interest - things to do rather than sitting around all day waiting to die - seem to sustain better "quality outcomes" than those that don't.

Some homes seem to end up with all of the dementia, bi-polar and disabled old people who have no money or family - where there are locks on every door so they don't "escape" or cause damage to others in the facility. It is far more complex and nuanced than many people can imagine.

#### Who wants to stay in a home full of sick and dying people?

When governments seek information they will often set up a "royal commission" where retired judges and legal types get paid enormous amounts of money to come up with opinions and recommendations.

The problems listed in the report are more to do with **systemic problems of management and funding** which are far more complicated than having a nurse. So the general problem of the "let us do something" to signal our care, understanding and virtuous superiority of "others" - is the main focus of the Labour Party and Mark Butler.

"Urgent reforms are necessary to protect older people from unnecessary, and potentially harmful, physical and chemical restraints."

"Deficiencies in regulation of restrictive practices have been identified as a significant human rights issue in Australia. A strong and effective regulatory framework to control the use of restrictive practices should be implemented as a matter of priority. The Australian Law Reform Commission has recommended that there should be a nationally consistent approach to the regulation of restrictive practices. It has also said that a consistent approach to restrictive practices in aged care and disability services is desirable 'both as a matter of principle and pragmatism'

"Recommendation 86: Minimum staff time standard for residential care 1. The Australian Government should require approved providers of residential aged care facilities to meet a minimum staff time quality and safety standard. This requirement should take the form of a quality and safety

standard for residential aged care. The minimum staff time Standard should allow approved providers to select the appropriate skills mix for delivering high quality care in accordance with their model of care. 2. From 1 July 2022, the minimum staff time standard should require approved providers to engage registered nurses, enrolled nurses, and personal care workers for at least 200 minutes per resident per day for the average resident, with at least 40 minutes of that staff time provided by a registered nurse.

The word minimum **is assumed** to mean mandated number. (Quotas, inclusion, groupthink - on average , etc)

Who is the Average Human exactly?

The recommendation is problematic and hints at MANDATING although it is only a MINIMUM STANDARD on AVERAGE.



Mark Butler's delusion - "all people will have a nurse onsite 24/7" - mandated insanity



# **Population Tension**



They struggle with appropriate/WELL JUDGED/Balanced (**against other things** which **need attention and focus**)/Utilitarian (Mills) levels of abstraction.



# Corruption – Where I draw the line

Human Population by characteristics, percentage engaged in Public Service Decisions and activities – Government, Courts, Police, Public Service, etc.



It is not about mandating GOOD, but avoiding BAD.

Not corrupt - not a liar, stealing, avoiding, no learning, not listening, not noticing, not keeping records, not answering questions, not acting in self interest, not interested in their work, not ignorant, not incompetent ,not on legal drugs all the time, not virtue signaling, not hypocritical, not tribal, not mob like, not violent, not abusive, etc.

This is not binary it is a continuum of definitions and measurement.

Things which can be defined and measured.

*Inclusion, Equality, Diversity, Good*, etc - are TOO ABSTRACT and difficult to DEFINE and MEASURE and are used so the DIMWITTED TYRANNICAL DICTATOR can control and abuse others.

I AM good - trust me - I will do what I think is "best" and "good" for all of us - you can trust me because I am "GOOD".

Cockroaches are easier to define and measure and exterminate. Then once you reduce the cockroaches - you have reduced "Bad" - "Bad" is under some control.

You don't want people being eaten alive in nursing homes by rats and cockroaches. So you implement that as a statement and then regulate, keep records and measure the infestations of rats and cockroaches and take action as required. You do not want people taking the wrong medicine. So the lock up the medicine, have clear instructions and systems in place, keep records and regularly audit those records for compliance. Empty vessels make the most sound? (Source not known but many assume Plato)

The "Chalcedonian giant," Thrasymachus, of whom we have already heard in the Phaedrus, is the personification of the Sophists, according to Plato's conception of them, in some of their worst characteristics. He is vain and blustering, refusing to discourse unless he is paid, fond of making an oration, and hoping thereby to escape the inevitable Socrates; but a mere child in argument, and unable to foresee that the next "move" (to use a Platonic expression) will "shut him up." He has reached the stage of framing general notions, and in this respect is in advance of Cephalus and Polemarchus. But he is incapable of defending them in a discussion, and vainly tries to cover his confusion in banter and insolence. Whether such doctrines as are attributed to him by Plato were really held either by him or by any other Sophist is uncertain; in the infancy of philosophy serious errors about morality might easily grow up -- they are certainly put into the mouths of speakers in Thucydides; but we are concerned at present with Plato's description of him, and not with the historical reality. The inequality of the contest adds greatly to the humor of the scene. The pompous and empty Sophist is utterly helpless in the hands of the great master of dialectic, who knows how to touch all the springs of vanity and weakness in him. He is greatly irritated by the irony of Socrates, but his noisy and imbecile rage only lays him more and more open to the thrusts of his assailant. His determination to cram down their throats, or put "bodily into their souls" his own words, elicits a cry of horror from Socrates. The state of his temper is quite as worthy of remark as the process of the argument. Nothing is more amusing than his complete submission when he has been once thoroughly beaten. At first he seems to continue the discussion with reluctance, but soon with apparent good-will, and he even testifies his interest at a later stage by one or two occasional remarks. When attacked by Glaucon he is humorously protected by Socrates "as one who has never been his enemy and is now his friend." From Cicero and Quintilian and from Aristotle's Rhetoric we learn that the Sophist whom Plato has made so ridiculous was a man of note whose writings were preserved in later ages. The play on his name which was made by his contemporary Herodicus, "thou wast ever bold in battle," seems to show that the description of him is not devoid of verisimilitude.

**Plato's words via a Socrates - GLAUCON dialogue in Book 6** .." By all means. In the first place, as we began by observing, the nature of the philosopher has to be ascertained. We must come to an understanding about him, and, when we have done so, then, if I am not mistaken, we shall also acknowledge that such an union of qualities is possible, and that those in whom they are united, and those only, should be rulers in the State.

What do you mean?

Let us suppose that **philosophical minds** always love knowledge of a sort which shows them the eternal nature not varying from generation and corruption.

Agreed.

And further, I said, let us agree that they are lovers of all true being; there is no part whether greater or less, or more or less honourable, which they are willing to renounce; as we said before of the lover and the man of ambition.

True.

And if they are to be what we were describing, is there not another quality which they should also possess?

What quality?

Truthfulness: they will never intentionally receive into their mind falsehood, which is their detestation, and they will love the truth.

Yes, that may be **safely** affirmed of them.

'May be,' my friend, I replied, is not the word; say rather 'must be affirmed:' for he whose nature is amorous of anything cannot help loving all that belongs or is akin to the object of his affections.

Right, he said.

And is there anything more akin to wisdom than truth?

How can there be?

Can the same nature be a lover of wisdom and a lover of falsehood?

Never.

The true lover of learning then must from his earliest youth, as far as in him lies, desire all truth?

Assuredly.

But then again, as we know by experience, he whose desires are strong in one direction will have them weaker in others; they will be like a stream which has been drawn off into another channel.

True.

He whose desires are drawn towards knowledge in every form will be absorbed in the pleasures of the soul, and will hardly feel bodily pleasure -- I mean, if he be a true philosopher and not a sham one.

That is most certain.

Such an one is sure to be temperate and the **reverse of covetous**; for the motives which make another man desirous of **having and spending**, have no place in his character.

Very true.

Another criterion of the philosophical nature has also to be considered.

What is that?

There should be no **secret corner of illiberality**; nothing can more antagonistic than meanness to a soul which is **ever longing after the whole of things** both divine and human.

Most true, he replied.

Then how can he who has magnificence of mind and is the spectator of all time and all existence, think much of human life?

He cannot.

Or can such an one **account death fearful**?

No indeed.

Then the **cowardly** and mean nature has no part in true philosophy?

Certainly not.

Or again: can he who is harmoniously constituted, who is not covetous or mean, or a **boaster**, or a coward-can he, I say, ever be unjust or hard in his dealings?

Impossible.

Then you will soon observe whether a man is just and gentle, or **rude** and **unsociable**; these are the signs which distinguish even in youth the philosophical nature from the unphilosophical.

True.

There is another point which should be remarked.

What point?

Whether he has or has not a **pleasure in learning**; for **no one will love that which gives him pain**, and in which **after much toil he makes little progress**.

Certainly not.

And again, if he is forgetful and retains nothing of what he learns, will he not be an empty vessel?

That is certain.

Labouring in vain, he must end in hating himself and his fruitless occupation? Yes.

Then a soul which forgets cannot be ranked among genuine philosophic natures; we must insist that the philosopher should have a good memory? ..."

Book 8 "True, he said, I had forgotten.

Observe, Glaucon, that there will be no injustice in compelling our philosophers to have a care and providence of others; we shall explain to them that in other States, men of their class are not obliged to share in the toils of politics: and this is reasonable, for they grow up at their own sweet will, and the government would rather not have them. Being self-taught, they cannot be expected to show any gratitude for a culture which they have never received. But we have brought you into the world to be rulers of the hive, kings of yourselves and of the other citizens, and have educated you far better and more perfectly than they have been educated, and you are better able to share in the double duty. Wherefore each of you, when his turn comes, must go down to the general underground abode, and get the habit of seeing in the dark. When you have acquired the habit, you will see ten thousand times better than the inhabitants of the den, and you will know what the several images are, and what they represent, because you have seen the beautiful and just and good in their truth. And thus our State which is also yours will be a reality, and not a dream only, and will be administered in a spirit unlike that of other States, in which men fight with one another about shadows only and are distracted in the struggle for power, which in their eyes is a great good. Whereas the truth is that the State in which the rulers are most reluctant to govern is always the best and most quietly governed, and the State in which they are most eager, the worst.

Quite true, he replied.

And will our pupils, when they hear this, refuse to take their turn at the toils of State, when they are allowed to spend the greater part of their time with one another in the heavenly light?

Impossible, he answered; for they are just men, and the commands which we impose upon them are just; there can be no doubt that every one of them will **take office** as a stern necessity, and not after the fashion of our present rulers of State.

Yes, my friend, I said; and there lies the point. You must contrive for your future rulers another and a better life than that of a ruler, and then you may have a well-ordered State; for only in the State which offers this, will they rule who are truly rich, not in silver and gold, but in virtue and wisdom, which are the true blessings of life. Whereas if they go to the administration of public affairs, poor and hungering after the' own private advantage, thinking that hence they are to snatch the chief good, order there can never be; for they will be fighting about office, and the civil and domestic broils which thus arise will be the ruin of the rulers themselves and of the whole State.


If Peta Credlin likes targets based on WOMEN so much - maybe she become a MUSLIM - they divide society by gender and have special targets for women too - like she does.

"Arguably the most important German thinker of fifteenth century, Nicholas of Cusa (1401–1464) was also an ecclesiastical reformer, administrator and cardinal." ..

"Nicholas of Cusa wrote De docta ignorantia (On informed ignorance) in which he looked as philospohical notions which he compared with the problem of squaring the circle. The quotations below come from Nicholas of Cusa, Die Kunst der Vermutung (Bremen, 1957) and J E Hofman (ed.), Schriften des Nikolaus von Cues Vol 2 Die Mathematischen Schriften (Hamburg, 1950). In De docta ignorantia, Nicholas of Cusa advocated 'informed ignorance':"

"If we achieve this, we shall have attained to a state of **informed ignorance**. For even he who is most greedy for knowledge **can achieve no greater perfection** than to be **thoroughly aware of his own ignorance** in his particular field. The more be known, the more aware he will be of his ignorance. It is for that reason that I have taken the trouble to write a little about informed ignorance. ...

Thus wise men have been right in taking examples of things which can be investigated with the mind from the field of mathematics, and not one of the Ancients who is considered of real importance approached a difficult problem except by way of the mathematical analogy. That is why **Boethius**, the greatest scholar among the Romans, said that for a man entirely unversed in mathematics, knowledge of the Divine was unattainable. ...

The finite mind can therefore not attain to the full truth about things through similarity. For the truth is neither more nor less, but rather indivisible. What is itself not true can no more measure the truth than what is not a circle can measure a circle; whose being is indivisible. Hence reason, which is not the truth, can never grasp the truth so exactly that it could not be grasped infinitely more accurately. Reason stands in the same relation to truth as the polygon to the circle; the more vertices a polygon has, the more it resembles a circle, yet even when the number of vertices grows infinite, the polygon never becomes equal to a circle, unless it becomes a circle in its true nature.

The real nature of what exists, which constitutes its truth, is therefore never entirely attainable. It has been sought by all the philosophers, but never really found. The further we penetrate into informed ignorance, the closer we come to the truth itself. ..."

If either of them paralleled an original chant for too long (depending on the mode) a tritone would result.[38]"
