The Consumer Price Index - Meaning and Use

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Preamble - The Rant

Tanya Plibersek declares that The Labour party is the most transparent and open political party in Australia and they work for "All Australians". With idle tales this fills our empty ears;
The next reports what from the first he hears;
The rolling fictions grow in strength and size,
Each author adding to the former lies.

And chilling fears astound the anxious mind.

"I have been sometimes thinking, if a man had the art of the second sight for seeing lies, as they have in Scotland for seeing spirits, how admirably he might entertain himself in this town, by observing the different shapes, sizes, and colours of those swarms of lies which buzz about the heads of some people, like flies about a horse's ears in summer; or those legions hovering every afternoon in Exchange-alley, enough to darken the air; or over a club of discontented grandees, and thence sent down in cargoes to be scattered at elections.

There is one essential point wherein a political liar differs from others of the faculty, that he ought to have but a short memory, which is necessary, according to the various occasions he meets with every hour of differing from himself, and swearing to both sides of a contradiction, as he finds the persons disposed with whom he hath to deal. In describing the virtues and vices of mankind, it is convenient, upon every article, to have some eminent person in our eye, from whom we copy our description. I have strictly observed this rule, and my imagination this minute represents before me a certain great man famous for this talent, to the constant practice of which he owes his twenty years' reputation of the most skilful head in England, for the management of nice affairs. The superiority of his genius consists in nothing else but an inexhaustible fund of political lies, which he plentifully distributes every minute he speaks, and by an unparalleled generosity forgets, and consequently contradicts, the next half hour. He never yet considered whether any proposition were true or false, but whether it were convenient for the present minute or company to affirm or deny it; so that if you think fit to refine upon him, by interpreting every thing he says, as we do dreams, by the contrary, you are still to seek, and will find yourself equally deceived whether you believe or not: the only remedy is to suppose, that you have heard some inarticulate sounds, without any meaning at all; and besides, that will take off the horror you might be apt to conceive at the oaths, wherewith he perpetually tags both ends of every proposition; although, at the same time, I think he cannot with any justice be taxed with perjury, when he invokes God and Christ, because he hath often fairly given public notice to the world that he believes in neither."

He was a polymath: as well as holding MDs

from Edinburgh and Cambridge, he was a classical scholar and mathematician. He was a pioneer not only of medicine but of political science. Arbuthnot understood the way of the world so well that one of his works might serve as a guide to modern life.

In 1712, he published his Proposals for Printing A very Curious Discourse, in Two Volumes in Quarto, Intitled A Treatise of the Art of Political Lying, With an Abstract of the First Volume of the said Treatise. Alas, he never completed his great work, or even started it, but nevertheless left very useful hints to governments, opposition parties, and managers in the NHS. I would recommend a copious reprint and its dissemination to all those interested (or do I mean stakeholders?)—at public expense, of course. The work is very short, and even with all the necessary feasibility studies, pilot projects, inevitable overruns, and so forth, the cost wouldn't be more than a few millions. It would improve the quality of political lying in this country no end."

Lies, of course, like all other human inventions, should be fit for purpose. "As to the duration of lyes . . . they are of all sorts, from hours and days to ages; there are some which, like your insects, die and revive again in a different form; . . . good artists, like people who build upon a short lease, will calculate the duration of a lye surely to answer their purpose; to last just as long, and no longer, than the turn is served."

Does this sound familiar? Perhaps a reprint isn't needed after all.

Obviously, Arbuthnot had the future NHS in mind when he remarked: "No man spreads the lye with so good a grace as he that believes it."

But there is also a general deep ignorance in the population - tribal - mostly women, blacks and weak minded men (young heroic virtue signalers) as they wallow in their self-pity and drama triangle based (Victim, Hero, Perpetrator) binary zealot entitled victim narratives (woe is me).

Peta Credlin believes in Targets for Women and Women are victims, **Amanda Stoker** used government money to fund the flag of the Black Nation (deliberately undermining the Australian Nation) - and believes in having an Office of Women because Women are special and entitled, **Rita Pannahi** lacks cognition skills (like most women and men now coming out of a corrupt and dysfunctional education system) and has trouble understanding the idea of "Premiss" and "Conclusion" - in a probabilistic way.

It is also a bit like the thinking of making sacrifices to the gods because then your crops wont fail and the believing it to be true because you make a sacrifice and your Crops did not fail. This seems somehow "Logical" to you and that if your crops failed then obviously you did not sacrifice enough - it is YOUR FAULT the cause and effect - premiss and conclusion are linked through you twisted view of the world. More than 70% of the world think this is normal thinking and cannot use higher brain functions or even question this type of thinking.

Now when Rita failed to provide evidence to support her "Premiss" and "Conclusion" (cause/effect), Greg Sherdian quite rightly made the analogy that "The Martians did not invade earth under the previous president either". Here Greg is showing his basic understand of logic and the idea that if you assert something cause/effect - that you need more than opinion and belief - you need facts and logic , hypothesis, investigation and debate otherwise you are simply asserting nonsense - your own beliefs. Rita is not asserting that she likes apples or that magic exists - she is asserting a causal connection of real things in the real world that other people are entitled to debate and question. For example Andrew Barr (and all the women in the courts - Lorraine Walker, Bernadette Boss, Helen Watchirs (Human Rights), etc) asserts that removing the rights to fair trial in Canberra courts will "Keep Women and Their children safe" as mandated and supported by the Australian Commonwealth Government. Now it must be said that most people have no real idea of logic, maths, probability, chance, cause, effect and related ideas. Most mathematicians do not understand the problem but they continue to make up laws and rules. **Carl Sagan** does not understand probability, I was impressed by **John Maynard Keynes** exploration of the problem the idea of probability in both causal and choice aspect within the mathematical models built so far. As far as assigning equal probability to anything asserted, I agree with Keynes and disagree with **Jacob Bernoulli on the point of "equal probability".**

For example I asserted that the Sun is not going to rise tomorrow if I fail to sacrifice to the Gods is that the same probability as asserting that a magic purple dragon will fly down from the outer reaches of universe to take its place? I dismiss both things equally without evidence - but I do not


assign them the same or equal probability I am not sure whether there is enough information to bother trying to invent a mathematical model (in a dogmatic, certain, totalitarian, authoritarian type way) to describe the idea of "probability" to those notions.

So it is not the problem that Rita is "stupid" - it is that she does not know how stupid she is - the limits of her skills, abilities and knowledge. Who needs limits to knowledge when opinion and belief cover everything? Introduction

Economics is not a topic I have studied but I have looked at maths and statistics. There seems to be some point when numbers are taken to mean something which then requires some kind of economic decision. The Consumer Price Index - CPI - is legislated and linked to many decisions automatically. I wonder if I can learn something from exploring the links with data and economic decisions. What is the rationale and reason behind these decisions?

CPI Introduction

CPI is usually quoted as a percentage increase - (of the cost of things) which is then used to raise wages, pensions and other things usually on an annual cycle. This is a kind of imbedded social justice framework which removes the need for constant bargaining and union strikes. One problem is that people on high wages who get a 2% increase (like everyone else) are receiving far more money than they need to buy milk, bread and other basic items. These are all fixed costs items which are not really described as percentage increase but should be implemented as lump sums. i.e. everyone gets a lump sum increase of \$1000 per year - regardless of how much their wage is - maybe cutting out in the top wage brackets. We have a progressive Tax system but not a progressive wage and pension increase system and this is leading to higher salaries at the top end.

CPI History https://www.abs.gov.au/statistics/economy/price-indexes-and-inflation/guide-consumer-price-index-17th-series/2017 has been running since about 1960 in some detail and the weightings are adjusted quite frequently "The CPI originally consisted of weights from 1948. Weights were updated in 1952 and subsequently in 1956, 1960, 1963, 1968, 1973, 1974, 1976, 1982, 1987, 1992, 1998, 2000, 2005, 2011 and 2017." - the idea being things change over time and things like "cars" "computers" and other technology changes change what is available to be "consumed" and what people choose to spend their money on. This is measured using the Household Expenditure Survey which asks households what they are spending their money on. https://www.abs.gov.au/statistics/economy/price-indexes-and-inflation/guide-consumer-price-

index-17th-series/2017. So it is like a feedback loop changing weights and emphasis.

The idea of the index is to get a sense of things changing over time - to see things like trends upwards - usually associated with terms like "inflation" - and things going downward "Deflation".

2.18 When determining what items are to be priced for the CPI basket, various factors are taken into consideration. Items:

must be representative of purchases made by the CPI population group;

must have prices which can be associated with an **identifiable and specific commodity or service** (e.g. a 420g can of baked beans, or adult general admission to a club football game); and

are **not excluded on the basis of moral or social judgements**. For example, some people may regard the use of tobacco or alcohol as socially undesirable, but both are included in the CPI basket because they are significant items of household expenditure and their prices can be accurately measured.

2.19 Income-based taxes, however, are not included in the CPI because they cannot be clearly associated with the purchase or use of a specific good or service.

2.20 The total basket is divided into 11 major groups, each representing a specific set of commodities:

Issues with CPI

There are many choices being made in how the CPI is framed - groups of people - which items are selected and how much weight they are given.

No matter how detailed and complicated the maths, formulas, statistics, measurements and special notes are - it is an estimate at best and heavily framed - biased - by those designing it at the time. It is also an average in every sense of the word - across time, products, prices, people, place, etc.

In Australia's index things like *Holidays* and *Take Away and Restaurant Food* are given high weights - where as in other countries there will be different weights and measurements.

Usually only a **headline number** like **2.3% increase** is mentioned and the policy makers then determine what made up the increase in the **basket of goods** - on average. It is **very complicated** and **the tendency is to expect to use the headline figure** - all the averages across all the weighted items - as the decision process. For example if food price increases were the main reason for an increase in a HOUSEHOLD expenditure - obviously different size households - would have different issues. A household of 1 person experiences a different change to a household of 12 people.

The CPI is used in comparison to the Wage Price Index - another set of assumptions and averages - as an argument to automatically increase set wages for people in work.

CPI is also used by the ATO for tax rate deductions and formulas, asset write-off, Reserve bank for decisions https://www.rba.gov.au/education/resources/explainers/inflation-and-its-measurement.html, private firms for wage negotiations, superannuation organizations for various decisions and private enterprises generally for forecasting and decisions (Banks, etc).

We also get the problem of giving a WAGE INCREASE of 2.3% to someone on a low wage - to *compensate* (A kind of socialism idea) for food price rises - for example - which gives a completely different outcome on someone on high wages to compensate for food prices. 2% on \$200,000 for the cost of food increase is \$1000 dollars more (twice as much) than someone on \$100,000 - yet is the person on the higher wage going to eat twice as much Food each year? Things go down in price as well - how does that work?

The RBA used a "Trimmed Mean" approach - using the CPI average by limiting the wage ranges from the bottom and top.

Various concepts are used like "lead" and "lag" - the timing of when things come into play - for example a household with young children maybe expect increases in deduction as their children get older. Young households renting may be looking at buying a house some day.

Many political decisions are now made on detailed data analysis on dogmatically entrenched models and systems every bit as flawed as the "Diet of Worms", "Papal Bulls" and the religious zealots and "experts in divinity" of the last few thousand years.

A variety of techniques can be used in economics to rearrange the wealth and money supply. Inflation is a major issue and this is strongly linked to employment - the general idea in society is that

One method to vary the current use of the CPI would be to look at the effects on prices in the average wage and then calculate a fixed sum amount to be applied for everyone. This would have the effect of raising the percentage wage increases for lower wage groups and result in lower percentage increase for high wages. \$1000 dollars is a 0.2% increase for someone who earns \$500,000 but a 1% increase for someone earning \$100,000. Another technique is to use small percentages in combination - some groups get a percentage, some the lump sum and some get both. For example of we have the concept of "Minimum wage" then why not have a concept of "Maximum wage" after which no increases apply?

Lower groups could get percentage and lump sum, higher middle groups only lump sum and those above maximum wage - no increase.

The social contract (see Jean-Jacques Rousseau https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/The_Social_Contract
) could not only include Taxation and government but also limited "pay rises" to keep inflation under control and provide government support at the lower end to encourage individual choice and change.

(I assert and can debate) There needs to be some incentives for improving levels of employment or "productivity" and changing choices in spending based on the relationships of earnings and expenditure and the risk of a standard %percentage increase across the board is it provides no incentives for change of choices.

https://www.gutenberg.org/files/32625/32625-pdf.pdf we can see the problem of definition. We already know that most people struggle with these concepts and maths in general and the Monty Hall discussion (see my previous articles) is complex and difficult to understand.

"In the great majority of cases the term "probable" seems to be used consistently by different persons to describe the same concept. Differences of opinion have not been due, I think, to a radical ambiguity of language. In any case a desire to reduce the indefinables of logic can easily be carried too far. Even if a definition is discoverable in the end, there is no harm in postponing it until our enquiry into the object of definition is far advanced. In the case of "probability" the object before the mind is so familiar that the danger of misdescribing its qualities through lack of a definition is less than if it were a highly abstract entity far removed from the normal channels of thought."

Apriori and Probability are difficult to define.

What is the probability that the sun will rise tomorrow morning and how much is that based on the **prior knowledge** of the sun rising?

e.g. if the sun sets then it will probably rise.

Is it because we have prior knowledge that the sun rises every day that the probability has changed to be more certain or was that "probability" always there regardless of whether we observed it or had knowledge of it (Apriori). If everyone on Earth CHOOSES to shut their yes and stop observing the sun - will the sun rise or not?

Is that really what probability is or is probability about something else? Like coin throws and choice of action? Can we choose if the Sun Rises or is it Fate, Chaos, Chance or something else? See https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Abraham de Moivre

If everything is based on what happened before (Apriori) then fate has already been determined and there is no choice - it makes no difference. So choice, chance (chaos), probability, fate, apriori, cause and effect, action and reaction, If and Then - are all strongly related ideas. At the quantum level - probability becomes more obvious and things like "spooky action at a distance" complicate things as well.

Let us look at trees. They grow from a seed but each choice of each tree in its growth is different and depends on circumstance. Is the tree choosing (maybe based on its initial shape and DNA) or is it entirely due to environmental chaos? Does the tree have some basics rules that it uses that provides some "choice" but then when chance/chaos arises it *innovates a new choice*?

For example Chris Bowen - the Minister for Energy in Australia says publicly "What we are doing is the right thing and people who disagree with me are wrong and they have always been wrong". Is he flexible, responsive and adaptable to the reality of the world like a tree or as pig-ignorant as a rock? Would Chris Bowen be categorized as Flora, Fauna or something else altogether. A pig-ignorant narcissistic deluded tyrannical psychopath - for example - smuglifunts - like most of the Greens/Labour types - all hanging around in their own "rock" garden bouncing off each other saying how "right" they are and everything else in the world is "wrong" and has always been "wrong".

So the problem becomes one of definition - what do we think probability is and when does any "mathematical formula" apply? What is Chance and Choice? These things are difficult to understand and we tend to see the results using trial AND error combined with hypothesis - *premiss and conclusion*. Double blind medical tests for example.

"9. This chapter has served briefly to indicate, though not to define, the subject matter of the book. Its object has been to emphasise the existence of a logical relation between two sets of propositions in cases where it is not possible to argue demonstratively from one to the other. This is a contention of a most fundamental character. It is not entirely novel, but has seldom received due emphasis, is often overlooked, and sometimes denied. The view, that probability arises out of the existence of a specific relation between premiss and conclusion, depends for its acceptance upon a reflective judgment on the true character of the concept. It will be our object to discuss, under the title of Probability, the principal properties of this relation. First, however, we must digress in order to consider briefly what we mean by knowledge, rational belief, and argument."

He touches on relation, (the relation of things to each other), belief, rationality, logic, induction, truth and knowledge. This is an important exploration if you compare the questions why do people believe the sun will come up tomorrow and also believe that witches and magic exist? What is the difference in how these certain beliefs are made and maintained in people's minds?

He observes the difference of **Apriori** (prior knowledge) between direct **primary knowledge** and **secondary knowledge** (Rumour and gossip for example or Habitual groupthink)

"Although it is with knowledge by argument that I shall be mainly concerned in this book there is one kind of direct knowledge, namely of secondary propositions, with which I cannot help but be involved. In the case of every argument, it is only directly that we can know the **secondary proposition** which makes the argument itself valid and rational. When we know something by argument this must be through direct acquaintance with some logical relation between the conclusion and the premiss. In all knowledge, therefore, there is some direct element; and logic can never be made purely mechanical. All it can do is so to arrange the reasoning that the logical relations, which have to be perceived directly, are made explicit and are of a simple kind."

.. "Of probability we can say no more than that it is a **lower degree of rational belief than certainty**; and we may say, if we like, that it **deals with degrees of certainty**. * Or we may make probability the more fundamental of the two and regard certainty as a special case of probability, as being, in fact, the maximum probability. Speaking somewhat loosely we may say that, if our premisses make the conclusion certain, then it follows from the premisses; and if they make it very probable, then it very nearly follows from them"

..." What is self-evident to me and what I really know, may be only a probable belief to you, or may form no part of your rational beliefs at all. And this may be true not only of such things as my existence, but of some logical axioms also. Some men—indeed it is obviously the case—may have a greater power of logical intuition than others"

G E Moore makes the case about the aught (David Hume) being derived of two things - the ethics or goodness of it AND the probability of the suggested action have a desired effect. For example Andrew Barr has secretly changed the laws about drugs and drug taking in Canberra - why did he think that was "Good" idea? And what was the probability of the outcome he was expecting? What is his **premiss** and **conclusion**?

The idea of asserted things being equally probable - and therefore being treated with the same indifference is nonsense. It is also a nonsense to reduce this to a simple formula in mathematics. The idea that everything in the world can be reduced to mathematical formulas - *if only we did more experiments and had more knowledge* - is the trap for any dogma of so-called "experts" in any field of study - medicine, maths, science, astronomy, government, social engineering, economics, politics, etc. We know this because things like the central limit theorem idea and Werner Heisenberg uncertainty principle https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Uncertainty_principle

Religion - if only we could torture, bully, threaten and kill more people we would get proof that the devil and witches exist and that we are "Good" and "Right" - Build me a better torture Rack.

Declare more Sins in the next Papal Bull"

Carl Sagan was a scientist who had a compelling manner, a deep and hypnotic voice and he spoke as if he was "right" and that he knew what he was talking about. He had skills in Rhetoric.

But in introducing me simultaneously to skepticism and to wonder, they taught me the two uneasily cohabiting modes of thought that are central to the scientific method."

Carl was **celebrated and awarded as a critical thinker** and **sufficiently "skeptical"** - i.e. that he thought something then he had be sufficiently Skeptical so therefore anything he asserted must be "Valid" or "True". He wrote books on skepticism and critical thinking and the scientific method - . https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/The Demon-Haunted World **Premiss** and **Conclusion**. The unprovable

Invisible Dragon which asserted as belief. "Sagan concludes by asking: "Now what's the difference between an invisible, incorporeal, floating dragon who spits heatless fire and no dragon at all? If there's no way to disprove my contention, no conceivable experiment that would count against it, what does it mean to say that my dragon exists? Your inability to invalidate my hypothesis is not at all the same thing as proving it true." https://archive.org/details/B-001-001-709

Sagan suggests employing such tools as independent confirmation of facts, debate, development of different hypotheses, quantification, the use of Occam's razor, and the possibility of falsification.

Sagan's "baloney detection kit" also provides tools for detecting "the most common fallacies of logic and rhetoric", such as argument from authority and statistics of small numbers. Through these tools, Sagan argues the benefits of a critical mind and the self-correcting nature of science can take place.

Sagan provides nine tools as the first part of this kit.

- 1. There must be independent confirmation of the facts given when possible.
- 2. Encourage debate on the evidence from all points of view.
- 3. Realize that an **argument from authority is not always reliable**. Sagan supports this by telling us that 'authorities" have made mistakes in the past and they will again in the future.
- 4. **Consider more than one hypothesis.** Sagan adds to this by telling us that we must think of the argument from all angles and think all the ways it can be explained or disproved. The hypothesis that then still hasn't been disproved has a much higher chance of being correct.
- 5. Try your best to not purely stick to a hypothesis that is your own and become biased. Sagan tells us to compare our own hypothesis with others to see if we can find reasons to reject our own hypothesis.
- 6. **Quantify.** Sagan tells us that if whatever we are trying to explain has numerical value or quantitative data related to it, then we'll be much more able to compete against other hypotheses.
- 7. If there is a chain of argument, every link in that chain must be correct.
- 8. The use of Occam's razor, which tells us to choose the hypothesis that is simpler and requires the least amount of assumptions.
- 9. Ask if a given hypothesis can be falsified. Sagan tells us that if a hypothesis cannot be tested or falsified then it is not worth considering.

Sagan suggests that with the use of this "baloney detection kit" it is easier to critically think and find the truth.

Carl Sagan then also examined the logical fallacies including personal attack, ad-hominem and other techniques people use.

"In 1947, Sagan discovered the magazine Astounding Science Fiction, which introduced him to more hard science fiction speculations than those in Burroughs' novels.[21] That same year, a mass hysteria developed about the possibility that extraterrestrial visitors had arrived in flying saucers, and the young Sagan joined in the speculation that the flying "discs" people reported seeing in the sky might be alien spaceships" The War of the Worlds radio show had happened 10 years before https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/The War of the Worlds (1938 radio drama) declaring Martians were invading earth (which many people believed as "true")

He **asserted that he understood probability** and had reduced to a mathematical formula where you could plug in estimates of certain numbers and you would get some outcome which had some meaning. He shared his beliefs in a movie "Who's out there"

The premise being that if organic molecules exist in space (some signatures have been detected in the solar system) then there is a mathematical probably of the existence of alien life. They then put numbers into a formula to say *Alien Life* has a probability - adding probabilities and multiplying things everywhere. 1 in every few thousand stars would have a "civilization" - even "better and more advanced" than us - all of these scientists then declared - probability then became a "DISTINCT POSSIBILITY" - because all the numbers were so large. "Tens of Billions of Civilizations" in the universe

So the Hysteria of belief was then based on groupthink "experts" (arguing from authority of maths, science and knowledge) who talked about the science "Special Advanced Maths and Technology" and the meaning of "Probability". They asserted that they understood probability and complexity. Their "Evidence" was basically large numbers and probability scattered with a few isolated poorly linked information. If the numbers are large enough then ANYTHING CAN BE ASSERTED AS A "DISTINCT POSSIBILITY".

Will these civilizations have the Eiffel tower - Dr Professor Carl?? Yes, they will have thousands of Towers - even more "advanced" and "Progressive" and "Better" than ours.

How can Carl's Hypothesis be falsified?

By searching all the stars in the universe - leaving no stone unturned - doing "whatever it takes"?

Carl failed his own skepticism test and failed to not only detect his boloney but subject it to rigorous critical debate.

Same and Other

The identification of groups for which measures - statistics - will apply - is hinged upon quite a deep philosophical and social construct. I call it "grouping", which can manifest into habitual groupthink and the division of societies into tribal structures which tend to tribal warfare, binary interactions and constant warfare. This was noticeable throughout history as each culture, tribe and city-state interacted - Athens-Sparta, Religious groups, Germanic Tribes, Mongols-Other. When people interacted as individuals as merchants, travelers, educators, intellects, artists, writers - this tended to break down the habitual groupthink. Even on the medieval battlefield and the wars between 1200 to 1500 - there emerges the idea of a military leader who is either admired or detested (and everything in between) and the consequential decisions which follow. In Roman times and earlier - a leader of a Tribe (an individual) who was approaching or interacting with other kings and leaders had a huge role to play in setting the standard for some kind of "fair play" or decent human interaction which resulted in some kind of mutual benefit and sustainability (https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Eukaryote Eukaryote - Dan Dennett and https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Eukaryote Eukaryote - Dan Dennett Darwin's Dangerous Idea) . The **individual knights** on the battlefield who **behaved** with **valour and dignity** were recognized. If people surrendered - then they were more likely to be spared and ransomed off to fight the next battle - if they themselves had spared others and **behaved well** - even during the most bloody of battles. Many English and European Knights lived into their 60s and 70s and may have been captured many times. Young knights who were captured early on in their careers - were ransomed and exchanged because of their large family fortunes and then resumed fighting later in life having learned from the experience. The 100 Years war 1337 - 1453 is one example of long running tribal warfare. Vlad the Impaler https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Vlad the Impaler took his capture badly by the Ottomans - especially because of the way he was treated - and the murders of his Father and Brother and took his bloody revenge on everyone later.

Some knights were despised and hated and sought out - not because they were the "best fighter" or a strategic Risk - but because they were the most despised individual on the battlefield - usually because of their brutal "inhumanity" as an individual - not the group characteristics or flag colours.

For example, Francis I of Lorraine, 2nd Duke of Guise, 1st Prince of Joinville, and 1st Duke of Aumale https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Assassination of Francis, Duke of Guise (His sister, Mary of Guise, was the wife of James V of Scotland and mother of Mary, Queen of Scots) was assassinated in 1563 because of many things - including his massacre of innocent people at Vassy. Treaties and agreements were documented after decisive battles and peace was sought by mutual agreement. The further apart these battles were - family feuds, dynastic wars, religious crusades, bloody mongol world supremacy and delusion (China, Russia, Khans, Muslims) - then the perception "fair play" changed dimensions. The more distant the *other* - the more mindless brutality of the tribal binary warfare and hence the more "shocking" brutal acts were considered by observers when conducted against one's own family or friends. Mongols, Religious fanatics, binary extremists and those who considered themselves to be "special" and different to the other humans tend to be driven by narcissistic self possession and sadistic brutality to other humans - deluded psychopaths (barbarians). We notice this with the Muslims but also the Americans in Guantanamo bay (supported by Australian politicians John Howard and Alexander Downer) - where brutal conditions, trial by torture (inquisition like) and lack of due process becomes "justified" in their heroic deluded minds as a kind of "ends justifies the means" mindsets that lord Action observed and we now observe in many people around us now - lead by politicians, women, ABC and black tribal types (binary causists and zealots).

Henry VIII of England was brutal to his own family as was Lucrezia Borgia - and this was noticed and remembered yet somehow the Mobs and Binary types cheer on brutality to individual humans who are classed further away as "others" (outsiders - not part of "Our" Group). There seems to be

human tendency to completely ignore the Human Condition in History. Plotinus, for example, says that in addition to Being, Motion, and Rest, "we are obliged to posit the further two, Identity and Difference, so that we have in all five genera.

In Aristotle's conception, terms like 'being,' 'one,' and 'same' have a greater universality than the terms he calls the highest genera, e.g., 'substance,' 'quantity,' 'quality,' 'relation,' and so forth. These latter represent categories or classes under which certain things fall and others do not. Not everything is a substance or a quantity, but in Aristotle's opinion there is nothing of which it cannot be said that it is a being in some sense, that it has some kind of unity, that it is identical with itself, and that, compared with anything else in the whole universe, it is in certain respects the same, in others different.


The fundamental relation of quantities with one another, namely, equality, consists in their being the same. The fundamental relation of qualities consists in their being alike, or the same in spite of some difference in degree or intensity, e.g., a brighter and a darker red of the same hue. The notion of relation itself seems to be as fundamental as that of sameness, since in comparisons one thing is said to be the same or different only in relation to something else; yet it also seems to be true that relations can be the same or similar, for the essence of proportion or analogy lies in one thing's being


related to a second as a third is to a fourth. The sameness of two relationships is the object of the comparison.

Such considerations are sometimes called "metaphysical" with an invidious tone. But no one, not even those who would eliminate metaphysical discussion as indulging in "vicious abstractions" or as verging on the meaningless, can easily avoid such notions as identity and diversity. It is not merely that ordinary speech, as well as scientific discourse, must use such words as "same" and "other" almost as frequently as the words "is" and "not" or "one" and "many." Those who are critical of theorizing and who want to save discourse itself from becoming "too metaphysical" are still obliged to give some account of what it means for things to be the same or different and of how we know when they are.

Semantics currently has vogue as a critical instrument for safeguarding discourse from ambiguity and nonsense and perhaps also for spotting metaphysical legerdemain. But semantics itself cannot go far in its own analysis of words and meanings without having to explain how the same word can have different meanings or how the same meaning can be expressed by different words. It does not seem likely that an adequate explanation could be developed without some theory of sameness and otherness.

I will explain my observations about this.







I downloaded the books - focusing on the books 2 and 3 - which contain the "great ideas" - all discussed and cross referenced with each other. I used the cross references to create links - like a network - where the ideas are the NODES and the links between them are the LINKS which I gave a weight of 1 to 9 to - 9 being the "strongest".

This is represented in an excel spreadsheet on my website - https://humanistman.com/wp-content/uploads/2023/09/Ideas.xlsx I used excel formulas and other manipulations in MSaccess to

produce flattened files of the network. i.e. 101 ideas cross referenced to each other equals 101 * 101 = 10,201 possible links in a matrix. Only 2,406 links were made (I added a couple of obvious ones as well) - meaning the matrix of possible links is around 23% of possible links exist. A relatively SPARSE matrix. Some simple analysis n MSACCESS using some queries shows the Idea (Chapter) on **Knowledge** was cross referenced with 53 ideas and strongly related (higher weights 1-9)







Note - the links data had many links with "god" in it but it was only a low weight of 3 or less. This analysis shows no accounting for the weights. I could have generated all the lines - like a basket analysis - a shopping list - a record of all the things shoppers buy on each visit - like - a record of all the ideas people talk about when they have conversations. So I could have generated all the entries related to knowledge each with their combinations progressively dropping off - the less frequent entries in the combinations. i.e. if God had a value of 1 in knowledge it would only appear in one combination of the conversations about knowledge.

But working out how to represent this combinational data is not straight forward. It takes some effort to choose how to do it. For example - when I look at the Links for Angel Idea and the links of ideas which refer to Angel I get:

It is then tempting (because it is less work - in a Fat, Dumb and Lazy way) to represent the combinations in a partially expanded way. e.g. A Maximum of 9 Rows for Angel Idea.

But we can see from above in the reverse links that when we have conversation about Immortality we talk about Angel 1 out of 9 times. - But when we talk about Angel we always (9/9) talk about Immortality. So we can see that it's a little more complicated than that. So all of these possible combinations become things like "When I talk about Angel I sometimes talk about Sin (6/9) - But do I include conversations about Soul (2/9) and how often?"- "Conversations about Being and Soul take place about (2/9) times when talking about Angel but where else are conversations about Being and Soul conducted? - What conversations include Being without including Soul? (and the other way around)"

So in terms of the data - when I make one link **Angel to Soul** and then a second Link **Angel to Being** then I have **automatically implied** a link between **Being and Soul** belonging to **Angel**. Each time I add a new link to Angel I am automatically implying a **link to all other things previously linked to Angel**. e.g. The Human Brain is a NEURAL network

2 to the power N gets very big, very quickly.

So even with 101 ideas - which you might think is simply a matrix of 101 * 101 - it is already more complicated than that when you put in the combinations i.e. 2 to the power 101 is a number with about 30 zeros following the first digit. (More than stars in the universe) Then when you add changes in strengths of relationships across a sliding scale (instead of 1 to 9) it becomes much bigger.

I really have to produce all of the pair relationships as links and then build up to combinations of 3, 4, 5 etc - this essentially is the problem which basket analysis tries to address. These numbers of paired links become very large - it is not simply a sum of the weights for a topic but a MULTIPLICATION of all the weights - INCLUDING the Reverse links. This is a PRODUCT of all the weights - which **for the example Angel above** comes out to (about) 1,238,347,284,480 (more than a billion combinations) of the **links which I have coded** which is a far greater number than 9 ROWS OF DATA. Most people have real difficulties in seeing this complication or understanding its meaning.

The **small universe** idea is the idea that although the universe is very, very large with immense possible combinations - things tend to **coalesce** into relatively smaller combinations. This is related to the idea of the **Law of Large Numbers** https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Law_of_large_numbers, the **central limit theorem** https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Central limit theorem, Statistical "distance" calculations and Dark matter theories (95% of the universe is "dark").

Rakesh Agrawal, while working with IBM

https://en.wikipedia.org/wiki/Rakesh Agrawal (computer scientist) was one of the people who understood the complexity of basket analysis type activities and he developed a paper and software describing a technique for doing this type of work using the Apriori Algorithm. I was part a group who saw a presentation of IBM's Data miner when it came to Australia. Since then, many people have tried to improve on this process (basket analysis - navigating huge matrix and combination data to find meaning) https://dl.acm.org/doi/10.5555/645920.672836 Fast Algorithms for Mining Association Rules in Large Databases Authors: Rakesh Agrawal Ramakrishnan Srikant (September 1994)

Since 1994 to 2023 (now) many organizations have spent huge resources doing data mining and data analysis on larger computer systems with more data to help make decisions about things - usually how to advertise and sell things to people so they can make more money. All Major shopping centers use data mining to place the most commonly bought items furthest away in the shop so the shopper has to travel the largest distance in the shop to find the Bread, Milk and Eggs. The shop is trying to maximize its profit and therefore you are required to travel the largest distance past all of the items to find the most common things you want to buy. Data Mining techniques are also applied to advertising and the internet - which is why Data Collection and Profiling - i.e. collecting as much personal data about you individually - is big business and worth so much money to people - to help improve their profits and treat you as an input to their profit decisions. You are being profiled and

"grouped" into a data set so they can maximize their profit by increasing the effort required by you to get what you want and the time and money you spend to get it. You are merely an input into the profiling and statistical manipulation tools.

Some people think that they know what intelligence is and that computer systems are "intelligent" in the same way that they think humans are intelligent.

Most people are too stupid to know how stupid they are and they also seem to need to invent a new "God" to save them from the human condition. Fat, Dumb and Lazy.

Determining MEANING from this kind of analysis is not at all intuitive or easy to do and requires a great deal of effort to understand what you are doing each step of the way.




After some effort in MSACCESS I produced a dataset ordered in descending frequency - left to right in each row of all the links. https://humanistman.com/wp-content/uploads/2023/09/LINKS_SUM.xlsx Most ideas are linked to fewer than 30 other ideas. This could be used to generate all the possible combinations (conversation "baskets")

I formatted the data for **PAJEK** http://mrvar.fdv.uni-lj.si/pajek/ which is very powerful network analyzer. It has a special format for a NET file which has the nodes at the top of the file followed by arcs (the links). I used my excel spreadsheet to generate the code.

The SAME PAJEK.NET file can be read by **ORANG**E in its NETWORK programs. Notice how there has been an attempt to move things around using rules.




I also investigated Chord diagrams - which are supported in R and PYTHON. I first noticed **Guy Able** using these some years ago, https://guyabel.com/ especially country migration flows.

A neat looking program online called **Charticulator** https://charticulator.com/ from the **Microsoft Research** team looked interesting so I created datasets for that software as well. After some analysis I changed the sort order of the ideas into a kind of group sequence where strongest links had the shortest distance to travel on the circle (as best I could) and also arranged them in logical groupings.








The colour of each box is according to my hand coded main colour scheme, the colouring of the Names of the ideas is the Secondary colour scheme and the colour of the lines is the strength from 9 to 1

Explaining What Bias means

In a "its not so obvious" and "what am I missing" kind of way I need to **explain what bias means** using the ideas database. Let us assume that the list of ideas is accepted as the universe of general ideas - which cover the universe at a high level of abstraction and link to lower and lower concepts until all words are mentioned.

The linking software for Pajek, Orange and Apriori have the concept of links and relationships (undirected GRAPH) or directional information (Directed GRAPH).

The classic example is the BEER and NAPPIES story. This Relationship has a **DIRECTION** - it is a **directed GRAPH**.

It was found that when NAPPIES were bought that BEER was also bought **very often** (fathers going out at night in the last minute to get NAPPIES while mother was with baby at home). The Other direction where BEER is bought and Nappies were then bought is quite a LOW relationship in that direction.

The frequency may well be seen in whole numbers of sales but **can also be stated as** a kind **relative percentage**. i.e. 70% of the time nappies were bought BEER was also bought. 5% of the time BEER was bought NAPPIES were also bought.

The problem is then about how you represent that as a fully described statement of data.

So in my example of ideas the links are explained as a **directed graph**. When you start off investigating or talking about ANGEL, you end up talking about IMMORTALITY every time and SOUL 2 out of 9 times. But the problem with the data formats is that we missing the initial starting point. The initial starting point is ANGEL and the so on all through all the ideas as a Chapter - each one is the initial node. So the Initial Node (the first node chosen) is always the main focus (in an unbiased analysis way)

So the data should be represented with the **both** the weight of the first idea and the weight of the second ideas being linked. Source to Target. BECAUSE the SOURCE IDEAS represent the UNIVERSAL SET. i.e. **Making the universal set the SAME WEIGHTS is UNBIASED**. This allows debate.

An important thing to Note is that **EVERY TIME IN THE DISCUSSION path** that you reach the **Angel** node - in the **path of your discussion** - the POPE will step up and start to pontificate and try to **take over the debate**. WE ALREADY KNOW he rates ANGEL as 9 - but HE KEEPS WANTING TO REPEAT HIMSELF. (I repeat myself too). We see this technique with Women, Blacks and other tribal types who signal virtue or special knowledge, power or entitlement - the **entitled victim narrative** is especially persistent - Religious Zealot tribal types - Jews, Women, Blacks, etc. Also "Crusaders", "Heroes", Scientists, "Experts", "Kings", "Visionaries", Corrupt, etc - they try to shut down the exploration and debate of ideas to maintain their power, wealth and control or because the binary zealots are too pig-ignorant to understand anything much at all. 70% of the population cannot explore a debate.


In every case of the **directed graph** (we all have to start somewhere) the SOURCE_ID is given the maximum weight and the TARGET_ID is given a weight between the Maximum_Weight (9) and the Minimum_Weight (1)

So you can see in the **various computer network format styles** that the implied Weight of the Starting idea/Source idea is generally omitted. I my example I am being quite EXPLICIT in making it 9 (the Maximum) - equally with all the other Source_Ids (i.e. the list of 101 ideas). Other systems try to implement this data by making a dummy term of ANGEL linked to ANGEL has weight 9 but this is not a consistent format or obviously understood. It may work better with things like stock numbers for example where today you have 10,000 **Angels** and 7 Sins. Angel, Angel, 10,000. Sin,Sin, 7. Tomorrow your stock numbers will be different. At this point we get into logistics, supply management, impact analysis, What-if scenarios and other related issues and techniques.

But in my format I am already thinking in relative percentage terms as represented by the numbers 1 to 9 - as a **general conceptual framework** rather than for a specific detailed task.


But when we talk to people we need to realize that every person will weight their starting ideas more or less strongly than someone else. "I care more about this than about that". If you presented a list of 101 ideas to people to rate the ideas by themselves - relative to each other idea in the set - a full set - from 1 to 9 - there will be many different answers - depending on their own BIAS their own choices. Opinion surveys use this technique of declaring the universe the getting to respond to the declared constrained set. Constraining the universal set of general ideas (lets all agree to remove - in a"democratic way" the idea of Angel from all future debate) is ANOTHER WAY of Biasing the debate of ideas. "We have already excluded the idea that White men are entitled to fair trial" - "Cancel Culture", "Heresy", "Blasphemy", Penny Wong "I have already apologized" (time to move on) "Heretical Ideas" are removed from the debate using the "Good Book"

Binary Zealots, Feminists and tribal types (Women, Blacks, Religious fanatics) tend to switch things around deliberately or are unaware of their biases and corruption.




So when we investigate topics and have discussions and debates about ideas - everyone tends to have their own list of ideas all with their own starting weights. For example Marxists will always weight "Justice" as 9 and "Wealth" as 1. Kings will rate "Aristocracy" as 9 and Scientists and Accountants will weight "Mathematics" as 9. Etc. So while the general SCHEMAS at the highest level of abstraction may have the words agreed on, as a general highly abstracted NODE, the weights are all different - the schemas are differently weighted. Also - by using the focus model - some people will have more detailed words that hang below the high level concept - that are more numerous and more developed.

Corpus of general High Level Abstracted Ideas



So some ideas are more developed than others - we might understand that an Idea exists - like "Animal" - the idea of "Animal" but not only will everyone weight that idea differently - some will develop greater detailed understandings of the idea based in their preferences, biases, education and experience. They will tend to call this their "knowledge".



There is a danger here that someone with a different depth of knowledge of words and ideas will think themselves *intellectually superior* to someone else who has different knowledge and skills.

Grouping Nodes

A sensible and useful coalescing of nodes is difficult thing to do. There is a large body of expertise in **network architecture and design** - we see with Transport, Roads, Rail, Logistics, Electricity supply, Canals, City design, Communications, etc. i.e. Co-locating things close together so they can interact more quickly and efficiently across multiple layers of interaction and complexity - the **opposite of what supermarkets do** when placing their products for sale in the store or other organizations do by making you "go through all the Hoops" (like a trained dog) or "Leading you down the garden path" (on a tour of everything they want you to buy), Web pages design, questionnaires, Grifters and Shysters in Tourist traps or bad trade markets.

For example - when **Dom Henrique of Portugal, Duke of Viseu/Prince Henry the Navigator** progressively brought together experience, grammar, logic, rhetoric, arithmetic, music, astronomy, sailors, explorers, astronomers, map-makers into one place (Sagres)



Having examined the ideas links by building strongly related paired relationships - that is to say - pairs of relationships where the **direction did not matter** (source to target) AND the relationship was strong in both directions - >=7. i.e. Building **pairs of Asynchronous strongly connected nodes** - I was able to build up, using my own routines and choices, sets of strongly related nodes which could be could be called **Network Hubs**. Most of the design was done by hand and is prone to my mistakes and biases. Hubs are grouped together about "equally" i.e. they are strongly and equally connected to each other so that each group can enter at any point and have immediate and quick access to all the ideas in any order in an **Asynchronous** (undirected) way. It is worth noting that some of the most commonly used abstracted ideas like **Good and Evil/Virtue** and **Vice** and **Habit/Custom and Convention** - relate strongly to my ideas of the **Binary Good/Bad** overlay and **Fat, Dumb and Lazy** Complacency. Both ideas are not strongly connected to many ideas yet binary thinkers will tend to seek to apply them to all the other related ideas very strongly. They behave like "free radicals" in the system and can be applied to any other idea in the corpus. It is our "habit" to ignore this and Now it is our time to attack it with our "Good/Bad" binary overlay. **Note** too how religious Zealots and "Experts" want to attach themselves to Sin to be the "Judges of Sin" with the "God of Certainty" in totalitarian, self serving (Profit) and ever more draconian, dogmatic ways. Theology of the "Expert dogma".



Another thing to notice is that these kind of Data mining and Advanced data analysis techniques are used all over the world - Some simply do not understand what they are doing but can "make it work" in the same way people can operate machinery without having to design it, make it or maintain it. They can "Operate" or "use" the technique with little understanding or training. Whether they use any "Moral" framework is also questionable.

Push polling, Advertising, programming people (hypnosis and mass hysteria) and Propaganda uses these techniques to keep the population under control. For example Andrew Barr has placed large billboards and signs all over Canberra where he provides constant messaging from his personal tyrannical regime to anyone simply driving a car or walking around the city, campaign strategists work on "messaging" to ensure everyone is influenced and pushed towards "right think" (Orwellian) - Dystopian worlds filled with mass messaging and brain control. See Blade Runner movie.

Emotional manipulation techniques are used widely in advertising and politics to constantly stimulate the population's Amygdala - especially **uncertainty**, **anxiety**, **fear**, **anger then followed by** "Good" feelings the "Right thing to do" as relief from the "fear" - as a pattern of **constant manipulation and control**. Data Mining and other techniques are used to find the best sequence of words and ideas and timing of "messaging" to manipulate the selected audience to comply with direction and suggestions.

Messaging and Manipulation is what Politics becomes in Tyrannies.

The Church and other religious zealots do this quite effectively as they manipulate people into sleepy hypnotic mind states where they can be easily influenced and become highly "suggestible"-they more readily agree to any suggestion put to them and attack anyone who questions. This remains as a post-hypnotic state associated with "feeling good" while doing the act which is suggested - killing witches, burning heretics - being part of the "feel-good" self-righteous mob. They anticipate this "feel good" mind state and actively seek out situations where they can repeat the suggested act. They become "witch hunters" and rationalize their insanity in books. See Mathew Hopkins https://www.gutenberg.org/ebooks/14015 Sects and other Cult type organizations lead by "Charismatic" Zealots use emotional manipulation to program people and reduce their questions and thinking.

The ABC, Greens/Left politicians habitually operate this way and tribal types - Women, Blacks and weak minded "heroic" men caught up in the drama triangle (binary extremist types) tend to feel very "good" about themselves they feel good while burning their particular heretic.

General theories are everywhere contemned; the doctrine of the Rights of Man is dismissed with the doctrine of the Fall of Man. Atheism itself is too theological for us today."

They prove their progressive evolution by assuming that a great part of the human race has not progressed or evolved; or even changed in any way at all. I do not agree with their theory of change; nor do I agree with their dogma of things unchangeable. I may not believe that civilised man has had so rapid and recent a progress; but I cannot quite understand why uncivilised man should be so mystically immortal and immutable. A somewhat simpler mode of thought and speech seems to me to be needed throughout this inquiry. Modern savages cannot be exactly like primitive man, because they are not primitive. Modern savages are not ancient because they are modern. Something has happened to their race as much as to ours, during the thousands of years of our existence and endurance on the earth. They have had some experiences, and have presumably acted on them if not profited by them, like the rest of us. They have had some environment, and even some change of environment, and have presumably adapted themselves to it in a proper and decorous evolutionary manner. This would be true even if the experiences were mild or the environment dreary; for there is an effect in mere time when it takes the moral form of monotony. But it has appeared to a good many intelligent and well-informed people quite as probable that the experience of the savages has been that of a decline from civilisation. Most of those who criticise this view do not seem to have any very clear notion of what a decline from civilisation would be like. Heaven help them, it is likely enough that they will soon find out. They seem to be content if cave-men and cannibal islanders have some things in common, such as certain particular implements. But it is obvious on the face of it that any peoples reduced for any reason to a ruder life would have some things in common. If we lost all our firearms we should 60} make bows and arrows; but we should not necessarily resemble in every way the first men who made bows and arrows. It is said that the Russians in their great retreat were so short of armament that they fought with clubs cut in the wood. But a professor of the future would err in supposing that the Russian Army of 1916 was a naked Scythian tribe that had never been out of the wood."

Conversations of Ideas

I tend to overlook the mindset of people when I talk to them. It is very rude of me. I should try to have some understanding of how people feel, what their situation is - situational awareness - whether they are under stress, a state of hysteria, afraid, uncertain, ignorant, etc. But then I have the problem that I could be accused of "speaking down" to people or treating them like children or being rude but not engaging them in an adult way. It is not always easy to work out **how to engage in conversations** - especially difficult or challenging conversations

I tend to operate in a highly abstracted frame - that is to say I speak of the general "Aught" - a kind of "Moral Philosophy" - a general "Human Condition" frame rather than concentrating on myself as an individual. 
the tempest of various passions, that tosses and tumbles them to and fro, and all depending upon others, and you will find a greater distance than betwixt heaven and earth; and yet the blindness of common usage is such that we make little or no account of it; whereas if we consider a peasant and a king, a nobleman and a vassal, a magistrate and a private man, a rich man and a poor, there appears a vast disparity, though they differ no more, as a man may say, than in their breeches."

So I cannot easily speak with narcissists, whingers and tribal types are stuck in the drama triangle and see themselves as victims, heroes and me as the perpetrator. I cannot easily speak with those who wear their ostentatious "breeches" and clothe themselves in entitlement, virtue and "specialness".

I Biased the ideas database by ranking each of the 101 ideas between 0-9. This had the effect of reducing all of the links to lower weights. For example if I weighted Angel as 6 - which is 3 less than the maximum weight of 9 - then every link with Angel in it would have their link weight reduced by 3. So if two lowly ranked ideas where linked the reduction would be cumulative e.g. -3 and - 5 a total of -8 of the link weight. This was quite an aggressive way of discarding links which I decided - in my biased way - as un-important to me and not worth discussing. It is like in a conversation when you hear certain words and ideas you bias them away from the weights that someone else is giving them. A Zealot may use the words Sin and God quite a lot because they feature strongly in their biases whereas I rate them lowly so I will tend to ignore the discussion.

I created three Biased Profiles i.e. that is to say ones where the default idea starting weigh was not 9 - **Jon**, **Zealot** (religious types) and **Drama** - as in drama triangle types. I then recalculated the links and nodes and graphed each model in charticulator. https://charticulator.com/

It took a fair amount of work to establish the sorted order based on the standard links and strengths, relationships and their strengths and progressively understanding the strength of each cluster. i.e. this sorted order on the circle is deliberate, designed and planned and without it the link patterns would be more difficult to see.



Each person brings their own biases and strength of links and pathways that they follow. Jon tends to have stronger links to those ideas on the right hand side. The Zealot has stronger links at the top and the Drama triangle person has stronger links towards the bottom left. So when you hear the expression "he has no idea" it might mean it is not linked at all or that is partially linked in a different way than your preferred strong link. So when you hear the expression "they came at the same idea from different directions" - you might imagine a journey along the pathways bouncing from idea to idea by their preferred biased links. So when you hear the expression "they are talking at cross purposes" you might think of this picture. So when see the expression "schema" you might start to think of what that means and how to share ideas with others.

Gettiing your wires crossed, following the thread of the discussion, missing the point, weaving a web of lies, cancel culture, shutting down debate, re-writing history, emphasis and omission, focus on the

issue, talking at cross purposes, getting on the same page, important idea (high weights), integral idea (many links), going off on a tangent, teasing out the issues, getting to the heart of the matter, firming up our understandering.

But if you have to or want to talk with them, do not say any more than this: "Listen, Jew, are you aware that Jerusalem and your sovereignty, together with your temple and priesthood, have been destroyed for over 1,460 years? "For this year, which we Christians write as the year 1542 since the birth of Christ, is exactly 1,468 years, going on fifteen hundred years, since Vespasian and Titus destroyed Jerusalem and expelled the Jews from the city. Let the Jews

bite on this nut and dispute this question as long as they wish. For such ruthless wrath of **God** is sufficient evidence that they assuredly have erred and gone astray. Even a child can comprehend this. For one dare not regard God as so cruel that he would punish his own people so long, so terribly, so unmercifully, and in addition keep silent, comforting them neither with words nor with deeds, and fixing no time limit and no end to it. Who would have faith, hope, or love toward such a God? Therefore this work of wrath is proof that the Jews, surely rejected by God, are no longer his people, and neither is he any longer their God. This is in accord with Hosea 1:9, " Call his name Not my people, for you are not my people and I am not your God. "Yes, unfortunately, this is their lot, truly a terrible one. They may interpret this as they will; we see the facts before our eyes, and these do not deceive us. If there were but a spark of reason or understanding in them, they would surely say to themselves: "O Lord God, something has gone wrong with us. Our misery is too great, too long, too severe; God has forgotten us! " etc. To be sure, I am not a Jew, but I really do not like to contemplate God's awful wrath toward this people. It sends a shudder of fear through body and soul, for I ask, What will the eternal wrath of God in hell be like toward false Christians and all unbelievers? Well, let the Jews regard our Lord Jesus as they will. We behold the fulfillment of the words spoken by him in Luke 21:20: "But when you see Jerusalem surrounded by armies, then know that its desolation has come near ... for these are days of vengeance. For great distress shall be upon the earth and wrath upon this people." In short, as has already been said, do not engage much in debate with Jews about the articles of our faith. From their youth they have been so nurtured with venom and rancor against our Lord that there is no hope until they reach the point where their misery finally makes them pliable and they are forced to confess that the Messiah has come, and that he is our Jesus. Until such a time it is much too early, yes, it is useless to argue with them about how God is triune, how he became man, and how Mary is the mother of God. No human reason nor any human heart will ever grant these things, much less the embittered, venomous, blind heart of the Jews. As has already been said, what God cannot reform with such cruel blows, we will be unable to change with words and works. Moses was unable to reform the Pharaoh by means of plagues, miracles, pleas, or threats; he had to let him drown in the sea. There is one thing about which they **boast and pride them selves beyond measure**, and that is their descent from the foremost people on earth, from Abraham, Sarah, Isaac, Rebekah, Jacob, and from the twelve patriarchs, and thus from the holy people of Israel. St. Paul himself admits this when he says in Romans 9:5: Quorum patres, that is, "To them belong the patriarchs, and of their race is the Christ," etc. And Christ himself declares in John 4:22, "Salvation is from the Jews. "Therefore they boast of being the noblest, yes, the only noble people on earth. In comparison with them and in their eyes we Gentiles (Goyim) are not human; in fact we hardly deserve to be considered poor worms by them. For we are not of that high and noble blood, lineage, birth, and descent. This is their argument, and indeed I think it is the greatest and strongest reason for their pride and boasting. Therefore, God has to endure that in their synagogues, their prayers, songs, doctrines, and their whole life, they come and stand before him and plague him grievously (if I may speak of God in such a human fashion). Thus he must listen to their boasts and their praises to him for setting them apart from the Gentiles, for letting them be descended from the holy patriarchs, and for selecting them to be his holy and peculiar people, etc. And there is no limit and no end to this boasting about their descent and their physical birth from the fathers. And to fill the measure of their raving, mad, and stupid folly, they boast and they thank God, in the first place, because they were created as human beings and not as animals; in the second place. because they are Israelites and not Goyim (Gentiles); in the third place because they were created as males and not as females. They did not learn such tomfoolery from Israel but from the Goyim. For history records that the Greek Plato daily accorded God such praise and thanksgiving-if such arrogance and blasphemy may be termed praise of God. This man, too, praised his gods for these three items: that he was a human being and not an animal; a male and not a female; a Greek and not a non-Greek or barbarian. This is a fool's boast, the gratitude of a barbarian who blasphemes God! Similarly, the Italians fancy themselves the only human beings; they imagine that all other people in the world are nonhumans, mere ducks or mice by comparison.
